- Drug dependency refers to the body adjusting to the presence of a substance and will exhibit

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withdrawal symptoms if the drug is discontinued.

- Drug addiction refers to a physiological and physical need for a drug despite negative consequences. This is considered outdated terminology and is often replaced with the term *substance use disorder*.
- Both connote a compulsive need to use a drug and an inability to cease using it even if serious consequences ensue. However, drug dependence can occur without physical dependence.

- Personality theories: specific personality traits related to addiction; traits include learned helplessness, low self-esteem, neuroticism, etc.; stimuli or events that increase the likelihood of a particular behavior
 - Theories of self-medication: theory that substance use derives from the motivation to alleviate negative symptoms. People take drugs to remove hurt and pain (emotionally or physically).
 - Biological theories: Genetic theory means a person is predisposed to addiction by hereditary influence.
 - Social theories: culture and social influences contribute to drug addiction
