Compare and contrast how biologists, psychologists, and sociologists study people. Identify the unique characteristics of sociology as a discipline.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Neutral Feedback: Biologists study how the human body works, while neurologists examine the functioning of the brain. Psychologists examine individual characteristics of people. These disciplines therefore place an emphasis on processes within the individual—whether biological, neurological, or psychological. In contrast, sociologists study human societies and are specifically interested in the interplay between social factors and individual characteristics. Unlike psychology and biology, sociology emphasizes how external social forces—such as economic systems, cultural norms, and historical events—shape human behavior and opportunities. People's experiences are shaped by societal forces.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Individual choices are influenced by broader social forces. Job opportunities depend on economic conditions, not just personal effort. Relationship decisions can be shaped by social networks and cultural norms, rather than individual preferences alone. Economic pressures also affect mobility, such as whether someone can afford to live independently. These factors show how personal decisions are connected to larger societal patterns.

Explain the similarities and differences of anomic and fatalistic suicide.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Anomic suicide occurs when people's lives are suddenly disrupted by major social events, such as economic recessions or pandemics, leaving them feeling lost and without direction. Fatalistic suicide happens in situations of extreme regulation and oppression, such as long-term imprisonment, where individuals see no escape from their conditions. Durkheim suggested that anomic suicide increases in times of rapid social change, while fatalistic suicide occurs when personal freedom is excessively restricted. Both types reflect a disconnection between individuals and society, but for opposite reasons—one due to too little structure, the other due to too much.

Discuss the similarities and differences of egoistic and altruistic suicide.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Both egoistic and altruistic suicide are strongly associated with social ties. In the case of egoistic suicide, a person's ties to family and community are weak. The person may commit suicide due to loneliness—suicide rates among widowed, single and divorced people are significantly higher than suicide rates of their married counterparts. In the case of altruistic suicide, people's social ties with others are strong—so strong that people may feel overwhelmed and lose their sense of individuality.

Suggested answer: Sample response: Economic factors, such as tuition costs, financial aid availability, and student loan debt, influence whether a student can afford certain schools. Family expectations and cultural background also play a role, as some students may feel pressure to attend a particular college based on tradition or parental influence. Social networks, including friends and mentors, can impact where students apply by exposing them to different college options. Additionally, broader societal trends, such as job market demands and the perceived value of a degree from certain institutions, can shape a student's choice. These factors highlight how college decisions are influenced by forces beyond individual preference.
