Suggested Answers to Case Study, Chapter 1, The Profession of Nursing

a. The nurse can increase the contribution of the client as a consumer in the following ways:

- View the client in a holistic manner.
- Encourage the client to participate in decision-making.
- Inform the client that they have the right to refuse or demand treatment.
- Provide education to the client related to their condition and treatment options.

b. The nurse should adopt the following methods to enrich the nursing practice:

- Practice critical thinking and analysis.
- Practice evidence-based nursing, which involves the inclusion of findings from the latest research into nursing practice.
- Encourage a professional client–nurse relationship.
- Continue personal nursing education through in-services and/or the attainment of advanced degrees.

Promote healthy choices that will help eliminate and prevent future fevers.	6, 7

Case Study, Chapter 1, The Profession of Nursing
